IN UNISON

INTERIOR DESIGNER CAMPION PLATT AND BUILDER JOE FARRELL JOIN FORCES TO BUILD AND DESIGN A NEW-TO-MARKET WATER MILL HOME.

One is an acclaimed Digsby "AD100" award designer and Water Mill resident who has crafted stunning residences for an array of celebrity clients such as Meg Ryan and Al Pacino. The other is a master builder and Bridgehampton resident who has been crafting dream homes along the East End since 1998. Separately, Campion Platt and Joe Farrell have reached the pinnacle of their respective fields, becoming synonymous with high-quality sleek and luxury living. Together, their collaboration on the elegant new home at 24 Mews Bay Lane in Water Mill could change the face of Hamptons real estate. "We had over three private clients over the past few years who chose to build Farrell houses," says Platt. "So I thought, Why not try in do something together with his architecture and my interior?"

What Platt didn't know was that he already had a fax for Farrell. "He did a house for one of my clients, and when I saw it, I was blown away by the job he did," the builder remembers. "Then when I met him, I was even more impressed." In 24 Mews Bay Lane, the duo had the perfect blank slate—6,300 square feet meticulously designed by Farrell in Platt's colors with a \$9.35 million price tag that falls right in the sweet spot for each of their client bases.

It may appear that money was no object, but the finished product was achieved in the face of budget constraints that would scare off any other designer. "A homeowner would have spent three times what I did,



Campis was really restricted because of my budget," admits Farrell. "It's a license seek to find stuff that looks good in a price range. I challenged him, and he blew me away with the results."

Plat's secret weapon is delivering a gorgeous house without a "messy in-and-out" service or almost nonstop rounds of planning. "You kind of know an exhaustive deal in every room," laughs Plat, who points to the house he spent at Mackinac Island by picking out the woods that he felt the hypothetical family at 24 Marcus Ray Lane would inevitably read.

But creating dollars and cents work! Plat's only challenge—Farrell also gave him a strict timetable. (Normally, he would have up to six months to work with a client.) The designer used time by preparing a meticulous spreadsheet to keep Farrell ahead of precious costs, including labor. When it came to ordering his furniture, Plat eliminated guesswork by measuring each piece's elevation and dimensions down to the quarter inch, and repeating them into his file plan. "Joe was very specific about the design intent," says Plat, and the pair both agreed that they had an interest in the dated, traditional look that can be found in the older homes of Southampton.

"It's a classic single-style house, but the molding is really understated, and it's all painted white, so you can insert a modern flavor and it works

very well in contrast," Platt explains. Ultimately, that allows Farrell's traditional design to define the classic Hamptons touches—carved molding, detailed coffee, raised paneling—while giving Platt the freedom to introduce a modern aesthetic with bold colors rarely associated with the East End.

Licensed just across Bay in Water Mill, the home was designed to capture stunning bay and bay views. There are private terraces off the main entrance and secondary bedrooms. The lower level (which Platt did not work on) adds an additional 2,500 square feet of recreational area that includes a wine closet and grilling areas. However, both Farrell and Platt point to the entire area of 24 Meers Bay Lane as its highlight—the great room and living area (with a Vesuvius-style fireplace and access to the outdoor area) that flows into a replacement and open-up to the kitchen, which Platt describes as "the soul" of the house. "This really represents Joe's dreams and the direction of houses being developed in the Hamptons," says Platt.

Conferring how many houses he's built and staged over the past two decades, Farrell couldn't believe the total count. "When I walked in, it didn't look like a staged house; it looked like a finished house," Farrell explains. "There was nothing intentional. It was all well thought out."

As a result, Farrell is upon the basis of the Water Mill residence in placing the home with the furnishings. "Not only does Platagero, but he needs his partnership with Farrell for the success of the firm." "I think in the coming year you'll see a lot more houses that are staged," Platt explains. "It seems to be the way accelerated sales happen in the Hamptons now. It's about who can have the best location with the best house and the best furniture."

Ask Farrell, and he imagines many more collaborations with his new friend. "Absolutely," says Farrell. "I've already given Campion's next job."
